WRITING SCAMS by Nancy Sharp Wagner Self-Publishing Liaison

As authors, our creative work is precious. Unfortunately, scammers are aware of this and often target us with fraudulent offers.

Publishing and marketing scams are common and often talked about. But a new scam has recently come to my attention: the promise of presenting our published books to investors, scriptwriters, and directors, with the hope of having them adapted into film.

I recently experienced this firsthand when I was contacted by two separate individuals. Both claimed that my book had passed all of the necessary qualifications, and they wanted to present my book to their investors for film adaptation. Both emails appeared to have been sent from legitimate companies with legitimate sounding domain names. However, when I attempted to research these companies, all that existed, in both cases, were one-page landing pages, with no way to contact anyone directly from those pages.

The most disturbing thing was that in an effort to try and convince me that their offers were legitimate, both of these individuals claimed to be associated with real companies, individuals, and organizations that actually do exist. One of them claimed to be working with Prime Video and the other said my book had been recommended to them by the ALA (implying that it had been recommended by the American Library Association) AND they also promised an upfront fee of \$200,000 - \$500,000. Additionally, one of the scammers said that they represented a company that is, upon further investigation, an actual production company. However, the company they referenced was a small company out of Philadelphia that appears to make biking films. I'm fairly certain that my picture book about going fishing with dad is NOT going to be something that they are interested in!

So . . . the moral of this story? If you receive an unsolicited offer (either by email or by phone) from a publisher, marketer, or film adaptation company, research those offers thoroughly. Check their background. Look for reviews or testimonials. And ALWAYS seek advice from industry professionals or legal advisors before making any type of financial commitment.


Trust your instincts; if something seems too good to be true, it probably is.



Since stepping down from the Regional Advisor position at the end of May, Alison Pearce Stevens has embarked on some new adventures—including a close-up encounter with manta rays in Hawaii. A world traveler and former biologist, Alison has had a variety of wild experiences: she's been chased by a trumpeter swan, bitten by a bronze-winged duck, and served as a climbing wall for geckos and baby bats. And, if that's not enough, she once had a tarantula try to climb into bed with her.

Once upon a time, Alison was Dr. Stevens, science professor. But life took her overseas, at which point she started writing about science and nature for kids, because she's an educator at heart and had to find new ways to share cool things with the world's most curious people. Some of these efforts included working at museums developing exhibits and curriculum. And since the deep ocean both fascinates and terrifies her, Alison develops content for the Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution from the safety of Lincoln, Nebraska.

Alison writes lots of fun nonfiction: articles, picture books, and middle grade books. All of her work is inspired by a love of science and nature. She is a regular contributor to Science News Explores, Highlights for Children, ASK, and other kids' magazines, and has co-authored four books for National Geographic Kids. Rhinos in Nebraska: The Amazing Discovery of the Ashfall Fossil Beds (Henry Holt BYR, 2021) and Animal Climate Heroes! (HHBYR, 2024) were both Junior Library Guild Gold Standard Selections. Rhinos also won the Nebraska Book Award in three categories. Detective Dogs will release in May 2025 as part of Holiday House's Books for a Better Earth collection.
