Let's Celebrate







A new season of Shop Talk kicked off in September with fellow Nebraska writers and illustrators as we reflected on our summers and discussed our goals for the upcoming weeks. We also discussed the struggle of making time to create how to embrace imposter syndrome.

Reflect on the following:

- The days you do not "create" are important "gathering days" and will enrich your work
- Goals that you set need to be measurable, concrete & have a deadline.
- Intentions are the energy and attitude behind your goals and your relationships.
- Manage imposter syndrome: Strive to reach your goal, not perfection & recognize even small achievements.
- Struggling with finding time in your day to create? Consider small blocks of time in your days to do one or two writerly things as making "progress" in your craft.
- Watch & reflect on author <u>Amy Krouse Rosenthal's Ted Talk, The Crevices of Life</u>
- Commit! What is a GOAL you can set toward your writing/illustrating life between now and the end of the year? What is an INTENTION you can set to move forward in your writing/illustrating life?

Don't miss our next lunchtime Shop Talk on Thursday, October 24th at 12pm with illustrator Chloe Burgett. Chloe will lead attendees through some simple exercises to figure out our best times to be productive and discuss how to start setting realistic goals for our writing careers.
